VRA Membership

The VRA Council has become aware that some Clubs have allowed new shooters to join their Club but do not insist that they also join the VRA.

This practice has dire ramifications in terms of insurance liability as Club Members who are not VRA members are not covered by the NRAA personal insurance which all VRA members benefit from.

Both the VRA and Clubs have a duty of care to ensure that all shooters are covered by the NRAA Insurance. Failure to ensure this could result in legal exposure for both the VRA and the Club in the event of an accident.

Club officials should ensure that all of their Club Members are members of the VRA. Attention to this administrative detail is very important and I ask that all Clubs implement this advice immediately.

The VRA Council also determined that a visitor (prospective member) should be asked to join the Club on or before their third visit to the Club as a shooter. Clubs should also ensure that casual visitors (non VRA members) sign the Club visitor's book before shooting on their range.
